

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


Is AI useful for ... ?

"It's disgusting that Fedora is even asking these questions when it is abundantly clear that the entire thing is a scam at every level."

> "Thank you for asking for feedback from the community. It provides a significant level of trust that those managing the project value the community."

"If you move an inch on this I am nuking my install and doing all my computing by hand on a whiteboard where no one can f— it up but me." "Fedora should not lag too much behind commercial operating systems, since it might become a big factor in choosing an os in the future."

> "I really love AI. You should make there be an option where you can either run it locally or in the cloud. [...] A voice assistant with powerful AI would be great."

"If we use AI it's important that we do all we can to use open models."

"I really must stress that [Fedora] must consider the massive impact GenAI is having on the environment." "I work as a sysadmin in Bioinformatics and I see on a daily basis that AI/ML, when correctly applied and utilised, can be a very powerful tool. But it must be seen as assistive, not as a total replacement for the human touch."

"It is inevitable, so the question isn't if we use it or not, the question is how we're going to do it, and to what extent."

"I trust you guys."

"I have always enjoyed and treasured the human aspect of Linux and Fedora. AI can be an optional add-on to the Fedora experience for those who wish to dabble in it." "Whatever you decide to do, do it in a friendly way."

"Don't FOMO."

"Don't be too restrictive. AI is not 'evil'. It's just a new type of tool and should be viewed as such."

"I think it is more obvious than ever that free/open software and models, as well as a local-first or, even better, local-only approach is critical to having a trustworthy and non-adversarial relationship with our computing devices."

Analysis of Survey Comments

Top concerns of Fedora users

keep it optional *keep it local / privacy* just a fad / hype / bubble environmental impact ethics / "license washing" Top concerns of Fedora contributors

just a fad / hype / bubble environmental impact ethics / "license washing" open source models keep it optional

runner-up other big concern for both: accuracy, reliability, "hallucinations" about half of these cautiously optimistic with a "human in the loop" approach



So.... now what for AI in Fedora?

The Fedora Council takes this seriously and are approaching it carefully. The concerns raised in the survey are valid. At the same time, many people are clearly excited about the potential.

Don't expect an easy, one-time answer.

That said:

- We have no intention of integrating any kind of non-optional personal assistant.
- Fedora doesn't plan to run any sort of AI cloud service connected to your desktop OS.
- We are unlikely to issue a complete ban on all things AI, or even all things LLM.
- Fedora makes room for people who want to do things to experiment.

We're using OCI containers to make image-based Fedora systems easy to build, manage, and collaborate on.


TODAY





The Scatter Problem













GitOps for packages, composes, etc.

GOAL

Provide Git interface to track the changes in various processes in the project

BENEFITS

- Familiar interface with a range of existing tools available
- Easy to see history, differences, branching, ownership, and status.
- Review and verification of each step by default
